II. BACKGROUND

The Commonwealth of The Bahamas is an island nation within the Lucayan

MESSICO Archinelago of the West Indies in the North Atlantic The Bahamas' territory

Archipelago of the West Indies in the North Atlantic. The Bahamas' territory encompasses 470,000 km² (180,000 sq. mi) of ocean space. The archipelagic state consists of more than 3,000 islands, cays, and islets in the Atlantic Ocean, and is located north of Cuba and northwest of the island of Hispaniola, southeast of the

United States of America.

For the purposes of this project two communities within the Bahamas were selected

as pilot sites to implement the territorialisation of drug policies that seek to address

drug-related vulnerabilities at the community level.

Abaco, is a 120-mile island chain in the northern Bahamas, located approximately 186 miles off the coast of Palm Beach Florida. It is the second largest of the Bahamian

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as for the implementation of 'One Abaco' - A Social Inclusion Pilot Project aimed at addressing drug-related development vulnerabilities affecting the island chain. These include but are not limited to:

- 1) The impact of hurricane Dorian in September of 2019, with recovery efforts slowed significantly as the country responded to the health, safety, economic and social challenges posed by the COVID-19 global pandemic.
- 2) Having a large immigrant population of mostly Haitian descent, faced with issues related to displacement, marginalization, social exclusion, and housing.
- 3) Its archipelagic layout and proximity to North America making it convenient for the movement of drugs and other illegal cargo by air or sea (inter-island and internationally), juxtaposed against the challenges of accessing goods and services, particularly in times of catastrophic events such as hurricanes.

The results of these and other societal shocks are cross-cutting, impacting social order, economic conditions, law and order, institutional viability; availability and access to key services and resources; safety, healthcare, and education.

Against this backdrop that Abaco was selected as the target community for this pilot project aimed at empowering persons living in conditions of vulnerability, to improve the health, social, economic and environmental conditions that elevate the risks of associated with the harmful drug use (including alcohol) and susceptibility to involvement with micro-trafficking networks. Through the utilization of social inclusion strategies, that are Rights centred (including a gender perspective), and focused on sustainable development, this project will prioritize the implementation of programs and initiatives according to needs.

As such, the goal of this project is to improve access to healthcare, education, social support, and protection services, for persons living in conditions of severe vulnerability because of exposure to poverty, homelessness, micro-trafficking, food insecurity etc., Thus, providing a rubric for the territorialization of drug policies for the country.

ACT NOW!!! PROJECT

The **Fox Hill Community**, located at the eastern end of the island of New Providence, is the target community for the **ACT NOW!!!** Pilot Project: Assets Coming Together for Adolescents and Young Adult Health and Wellness. ACT NOW!!! Is a comprehensive 8-month community-based initiative targeting multiple systems/ strategies (e.g. training impactors and youth influencers, providing information, developing life skills,

Using the 'Unda da Tree' mentality, this program seeks to bring prevention and intervention services into the local community by encouraging community leaders to be involved in the planning, development, implementation, and evaluation of ACT NOW's programs and strategies. As such, this intervention is theoretically guided by the Social Development Model and will utilize a Public Health approach.

The Fox Hill Community was selected as a target community for the implementation of this pilot project also due to several vulnerability factors, including:

The Goal of the ACT NOW!!! Project is to establish and strengthen collaboration among community actors to support the community coalition working together to prevent and reduce youth substance misuse, violence, and crime in the Fox Hill Community.

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IILA, as an implementing partner of the COPOLAD III programme, is the organisation responsible for the allocation of grants that allow the participation of civil society organisations in drug policy reform and/or implementation processes. These processes must be previously agreed with the institutions responsible for drug policy.

Information on the objectives of the call including the definition of activities that can or may be funded is provided below.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT IN WHICH THE CALL IS FRAMED

The Programme of cooperation between Latin America, the Caribbean and the European Union on drug policies, COPOLAD III, is a programme financed by the European Union (Directorate General on International Partnerships – DG INTPA) and is part of the growing cooperation between the EU and the countries of Latin America and the Caribbean in the field of the fight against drug trafficking. This sector constitutes a policy line in which Italy has a recognised experience, which is requested and appreciated by the Authorities of the Region thanks also to the active participation of Italian bodies and institutions in projects of a similar nature, such as PAcCTO, EUROFRONT and EUROSOCIAL. For this reason, the International Italo-Latin American Organisation - IILA became part of the Consortium managing the Programme, together with the Spanish agency Fundación Internacional y para Iberoamérica de Administraciones y Políticas Públicas - FIIAPP, with the mandate to involve the main Italian institutions specialised in this particular topic. The European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction - EMCDDA, and the German-GIZ Cooperation also participate in the Programme as partners.

 General objective: Contribute to the reduction of drug demand and supply in LAC countries by facilitating the generation and implementation of more balanced, evidence-based, comprehensive, and therefore more effective drug policies, fully



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respecting the national sovereignty of LAC countries in accordance with the principle of non-interference in the internal affairs of States.

The general purpose of the Government of The Bahamas is to develop two pilot experiences that serve as matrices for the strengthening of organized civil society in the implementation of local strategies especially aimed at highly vulnerable communities linked with immigration processes, poverty, illicit activities and micro criminality related to drugs, community violence, deterioration of environmental conditions, loss of installed capacity in the management of community resources and in confronting vulnerabilities.

This action seeks to obtain high inter-ministerial support at the level of Cabinet, through the National Anti-drug Secretariat of the Ministry of National Security and the Ministry of Health. Other Ministries and organizations necessary to carry out the activities include: The Public Hospitals Authority and the Sandilands Rehabilitation Centre; the Department of Public Health; The Ministry of Social Development and Labour, including Urban Renewal Centres; Sustainable Development Goals Unit in the Office of the Prime Minister; The Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, The Ministry of Education Technical & Vocational Training; Ministry of Youth, Sports & Culture, the
